Risks: When Too Much Vitamin D is Too Much

Too much vitamin D may be just as bad as too little, a recent study suggests.

Vitamin D supplements reduce blood levels of C-reactive protein, or CRP, an indicator of inflammation that is linked to cardiovascular disease. But supplements help only up to a point.

In a study of more than 15,000 adults ages 18 to 85, researchers at Johns Hopkins University found that after blood levels exceeded 21 nanograms per milliliter — the lower end of what is usually considered normal — any additional vitamin D led to an increase in CRP.

The association held after the researchers accounted for the effects of factors like obesity, smoking, cholesterol and high blood pressure. There was also a doseresponse relationship: Above 21 units, each 10-unit increase in vitamin D was accompanied by an increase of 0.06 milligrams per deciliter in CRP.

"Vitamin D is good to a certain level," said the lead author, Dr. Muhammad Amer, an assistant professor of medicine at Johns Hopkins. "But don't just keep on taking it. Have your blood drawn and your levels checked."

Previous studies of vitamin D supplementation have produced inconsistent results, with some trials showing a decrease in inflammatory markers and others showing no effect. The finding that the benefit is apparent only at lower levels of vitamin D, the authors write, may help explain these conflicting findings.

The study was published online in The American Journal of Cardiology.

Not a love story: The St. Valentine's Day Massacre

On Feb. 14, we remember our sweethearts, our loved ones, and of course . . . the St. Valentine's Day Massacre of 1929, in which seven Chicago mobsters were lured to a garage on the north side of the city and gunned down by killers hired by notorious gangster Al Capone.

The killings erupted from a conflict between Capone and a rival gang led by George "Bugs" Moran, who was the primary target of the massacre. According to one account, Capone hired members of Detroit's infamous Purple Gang to carry out the hit. They promised Moran's crew a shipment of bootleg whiskey in order to get them to a warehouse on Clark Street.

Two of the four gunmen wore uniforms of the Chicago Police Department and drove a stolen police car. When they entered the warehouse, the gangsters inside initially believed they were being arrested. They allowed themselves to be disarmed and lined up against the wall before realizing that they were about to be murdered.

After the gunshots died out, the two uniformed killers and their two accomplices left the building, with bystanders assuming the police had carried out an arrest.

Police identified the shooters, but they were never actually prosecuted for the killing (although one did go to jail for shooting a police officer in an unrelated incident). Still, the outcry over the killings marked the beginning of the end of the Capone gang's power in Chicago, and it captured the imagination of the public for years afterward.
